Course Description: Introduction to the principles of geomorphology; earth materials; major features of crustal morphology; land forming processes of water, wind, waves and ice; human impact on earth surface processes. One hour laboratory session approximately every other week; a local field trip.

Brief description of duties: Preparing materials for lectures and class discussions; preparing course syllabi and selecting relevant readings; developing, administering, and marking course assignments, tests and exams; test/exam invigilation; holding regular office hours; designing and overseeing labs; and supervising teaching assistants.
